Track & Field meetings

There were very detailed discussions on progress for the draft 2019 programme. It was still expected to have an Indoor Championship, an Outdoor Championship, and four league meetings (Swansea, Cardiff, Newport, Cardiff) plus a meeting at Wrexham. The Secretary was given final action points for reservations, etc.

Draft dates had to be with Welsh Athletics to formalise the programme with those of all the other clubs shortly to ensure there were no clashes and there were sufficient officials available for the events. Welsh Athletics holds a meeting in November for this purpose, at which WMAA would be represented by Mel James.

Cross Country and Road events

The British and Irish Masters Cross Country International Meeting arrangements were still going well (17 November in Singleton Park, Swansea). Committee members volunteered for various tasks on and before the day. Assistance was also coming from the University and Swansea Harriers. Closing dates and the Welsh selection process are on the BMAF website – there are only a few days to go!

BMAF

Power of 10
